

2 Corinthians 3:1-17

1. Shall we start introducing ourselves to you again? Perhaps we need, like some, cover letters to you
and from you?

2. You are our letter, written in our hearts, understood and read by all people.

3. You show that you are a letter from Christ, ministered by us, written not with ink but with the Spirit of the living God, not on tablets of stone. on plates, but on plates of living hearts.

4. We have this confidence in God through Christ.

5. Not because we are fit to conceive anything as if from ourselves, but our fitness from
God,

6. who has made us competent as ministers of a new covenant, not of the letter but of the Spirit, because the letter kills, and the Spirit gives life.

7. If the ministry of death, engraved in letters in stone, was so glorious that the children of Israel could not look intently at Moses' face because of the glory of his face, which was passing away,

8. How much more glorious will the ministry of the Spirit be?

9. If the ministry of condemnation is glorious, much more glorious is the ministry of righteousness.

10. What was glorious is not glorious at all compared to the glory that surpasses all.

11. If what passes away was glorious, what remains is far more glorious.

12. Therefore, since we have such hope, we speak with great boldness and boldness,

13. not like Moses, who would put a hood over his face so that the children of Israel would not see what was
passes.

14. But their minds were blinded. To this day, the same hood remains un-removed when reading the Old Testament.
Testament, because it is taken away in Christ.

15. Even to this day, when Moses is read, the veil still covers their hearts.

16. But when a person turns to the Lord, the veil is taken away.

17. The Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom.
